## **BASIC INFORMATION OF NATIONAL SCHEME SERVICE (NSS)**

The University Grants Commission recommended to introduce the voluntary national service in educational institutions. It was headed by S. Radhakrishnan. In 1950, this idea was considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education.

The idea of labour and social services by the Indian student got stressed in the five-year plan draft in 1952. This was later recommended to be considered as a prerequisite for graduation by Jawaharlal Nehru in 1958.

Universities' and higher education institutions' student representatives were brought together in a conference meeting in May 1969 by the Ministry of Education and the University Grants Commission. There, the idea of incorporating a national service scheme as a national integration instrument got agreed unanimously. Finally in 1969, on 24th September, the national service scheme was launched at 37 universities all states by then Union Education Minister V.K.R.V. Rao. So, V.K.R.V Rao is called the father of NSS.

### **NSS Day:**

The national service scheme day is observed on **24th September** as in the year 1969, the national service scheme was launched on this day. Every year the NSS day is celebrated through different competitions like quiz, drama, presentation and speech.

### **NSS logo**

Based on giant Rath Wheel of the world famous Konark Sun Temple situated in Orissa. The Red and Blue colors contains in the logo motivates the NSS volunteers to be active and energetic for the nation building. The wheel stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social change.

### **NSS Head Headquarter and Regional Office**

The National Service Scheme headquarters is located in New Delhi, India. The national-level activities of the national service scheme, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports plans the policies and takes care of the implementation and evaluation of the programme. The program advisor helps in planning and implementing the programmes and also takes part in encouraging the research and publication work related to national service schemes.

Regional centres in the country have been established by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. Those centres take care of the effective implementation of the national service scheme programme in the state levels.

State Liaison Officer is the head of NSS at the state level. The State Liaison Officer makes sure that in the State budget, budgetary provisions are made for the national service scheme programme. On behalf of the state NSS cell, the officer coordinates with state agencies and departments for implementation of different national service scheme programmes. There are a total of 15 number of Regional Directorates across the nation.

## NSS Motto

**‘Not Me But You’** – this is the NSS motto that symbolizes the requirement for selfless service and also indicates the true sense of democratic living. Students develop and learn to respect and value the point of view of other people and also understand the value of other living beings. NSS motto reflects that an individual’s well being completely depends on the wellbeing of society as a whole.

## Service NSS Volunteers

Any student enrolled as NSS Volunteer should put in at least 120 hours of social work in a year for a continuous period of two years i.e. 240 hours in two years, on different programmes other than special camping. He should participate fully in the NSS Programmes and should be fully conversant with the objectives of NSS. Out of the 120 hours of service which each student volunteer is expected to put in a year, at least 20 hours should be utilized in the first year for pre-placement orientation programme in the following manner:

1. General Orientation	2 hours
2. Special Orientation	8 hours
3. <u>Programme Skill Learning</u>	<u>10 hours</u>

## AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF NSS

1. Development of the personality of students through community service.
2. To work with/among people.
3. To identify the needs and problems of the community and involve themselves in problem-solving exercise;
4. To develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility;
5. To enhance his/her knowledge of himself/herself and the community;
6. To acquire leadership qualities and democratic values;
7. To develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters; and
8. To practice national integration and social harmony.
9. To engage in creative and constructive social action.
10. To gain skill in the exercise of democratic leadership.
11. To gain skills in programme development to enable him/her for self-employment;
12. To bridge the gulf between the educated and the uneducated masses; and
13. To promote the will to serve the weaker section of the community.

## DUTIES OF NSS VOLUNTEERS

1. To establish rapport with the people in the project area
2. To Identify needs, problems and resources of the community;
3. To design Plan and Programmes and carry out the plans;
4. To relate their learning and experience towards finding solutions to the problems identifies; and
5. To record the activities in his work diary systematically and assess the progress periodically and effect changes as and when needed.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT FOR NSS VOLUNTEERS**

1. All volunteers shall work under the guidance of a group leader nominated by the programme officer.
2. They shall make themselves worthy of the confidence and cooperation of the group/community leadership.
3. They shall scrupulously avoid entering into any controversial issues.
4. They shall keep day-to-day record of their activities/ experience in the enclosing pages of the diary and submit to the Group Leader/Programme Officer for periodic guidance.
5. It is obligatory on the part of every volunteer to wear the NSS BADGE while on work.

### **NSS CERTIFICATE**

A student volunteer who has completed 240 hours of work and attended a special camp during the course of two years is eligible for NSS certificate from university. This certificate gives weightage for higher studies and is an additional qualification for appointment in public services.

### **NSS UNIT OF HAJI ANFAR ALI COLLEGE**

The NSS Unit of Haji Anfar Ali College was established in 2014. The first Co-coordinator of the Unit was Sibbir Ahmed Osmani. Other members of the Unit were A Rouf Laskar, A Sibor Talukdar, Majharul Islam, Sayed Ahmed and Pijush Chakraborty. In 2022 Nazrul Hussain is appointed as the Programme Officer of the Unit. Other members are ex-programme officer Sibbir Ahmed Osmani, Dr. Adidur Rahman, IQAC Coordinator, Pijush Chakraborty, Coordinator, Games and Sports.

On the basis of guidelines of NSS, the NSS Unit of Haji Anfar Ali College adopted a village, the Burigaon Village, near about two kilometer distance from the college. Many awareness programmes are convened by the unit for the greater interest of the people as a whole and in particular for the village.

Since its inception, the NSS Unit has been performing different activities in diverse field as its routine activities. 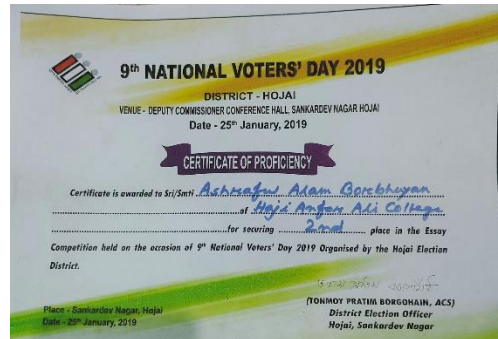

### **World Environment Day 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2018**

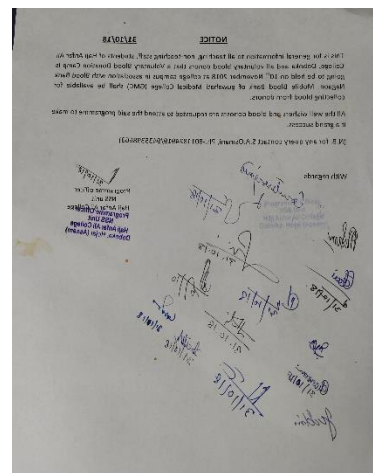

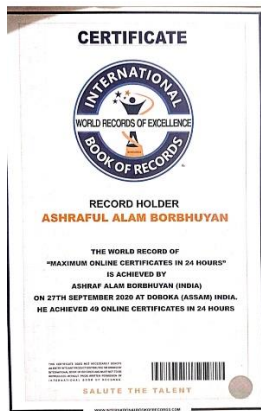

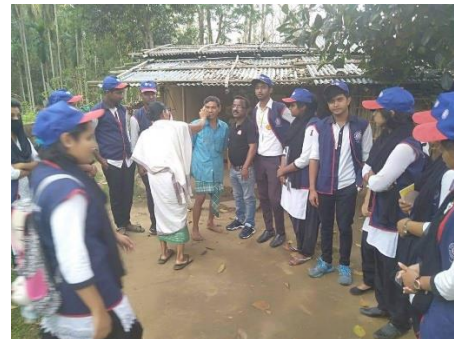


**NSS Special Camp**

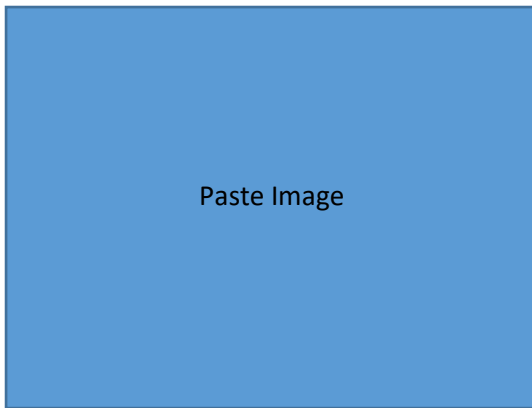

## **“National Children Day Report”** **14<sup>th</sup> November, 2022**

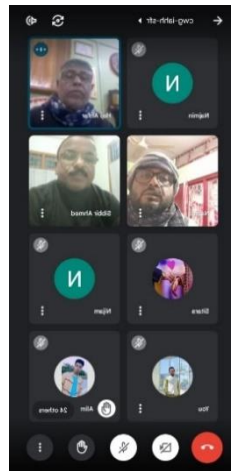

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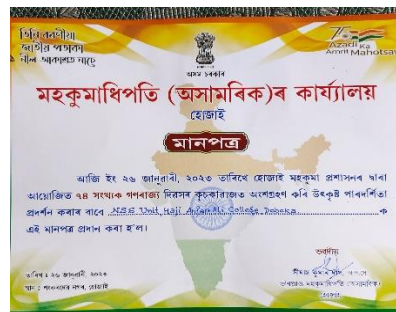


**NSS Report on 74<sup>th</sup> celebration of Republic Day/2023**
