FOUR YEARS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUGP) IN BRIEF:

The NEP envisages several transformative initiatives in higher education. These include:

Introducing holistic and multidisciplinary undergraduate education that would help develop all capacities of human beings - intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, ethical, and moral - in an integrated manner; soft skills, such as complex problem solving, critical thinking, creative thinking, communication skills; and rigorous specialization in a chosen field (s) of learning.

Undergraduate degree programmes of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:

- UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study,
- UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study,
- Bachelor's degree after a 3-year (6 semesters) programme of study,
- 4-year bachelor's degree (honours) after eight semesters programme of study. If the student completes a rigorous research project in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree (honours with research).
- 4-year bachelor's degree programme is considered a preferred option since it would provide the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per the choices of the student.

Major and Minor disciplines:

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline. Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.

Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma, and Degrees UG Certificate:

Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma:

Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. Such students are al-



lowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree:

Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement.

4-year UG Degree (Honours):

A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 160 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):

Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students who secure 160 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

UG Degree Programmes with Single Major:

A student has to secure a minimum of 50% credits from the major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a single major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 60 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a single major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with single major.

UG Degree Programmes with Double Major:

A student has to secure a minimum of 40% credits from the second major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a double major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 48 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a double major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 64 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with double major.

Interdisciplinary UG Programmes:

The credits for core courses shall be distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects so as to get core competence in the interdisciplinary programme. For example, a degree in Econometrics requires courses in economics, statistics, and mathematics. The total credits to core courses shall be distributed so that the student gets full competence



in Econometrics upon completion of the programme. The degree for such students will be awarded as B.Sc. in Econometrics for a 3-year UG programme or B.Sc. (Honours) / B.Sc. (Honours with Research) in Econometrics for a 4-year UG programme.

Multidisciplinary UG Programmes:

In the case of students pursuing a multidisciplinary programme of study, the credits to core courses will be distributed among the broad disciplines such as Life sciences, Physical Sciences, Mathematical and Computer Sciences, Data Analysis, Social Sciences, Humanities, etc., For example, a student who opts for a UG program in Life sciences will have the total credits to core courses distributed across Botany, Zoology and Human biology disciplines. The degree will be awarded as B.Sc. in Life Sciences for a 3-year programme and B.Sc. (Honours) in Life Sciences or B.Sc. (Honours with Research) for a 4-year programme without or with a research component respectively. The statutory bodies of the Universities and Colleges such as the Board of Studies and Academic Council will decide on the list of courses under major category and credit distribution for double major, interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary programmes.

Eligibility for the UG Programmes :

Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (12th Grade) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education corresponding to Level-4. 3.4

Duration of the Programme :

The duration of the UG programme is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first or second year, the student will be given a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided they secure the prescribed number of credits (as given in table 3). Students who exit with a UG certificate or UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme.

Computation of SGPA and CGPA :

The UGC recommends the following procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): i. The SGPA is the ratio of the sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e. $SGPA (S_i) = \sum (C_i \times G_i) / \sum C_i$ Where C_i is the number of credits of the i th course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i th course. The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e. $CGPA = \sum (C_i \times S_i) / \sum C_i$ where S_i is the SGPA of the i th semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.







2. BRIEF HISTORY:

Haji Anfar Ali College, the premier seat of higher learning was put on a firm foundation in the mid 80s of the twentieth century at Daboka, the newly formed Hojai District in Assam. It is an irony that even after the passage of four decades of independence, there had been no institution of higher learning until 1986 in such a place of historical significance. Though late, the thought of setting up an institution of higher education took shape in the minds of the intelligentsia and Haji Anfar Ali College is the ultimate fruition of the hopes and aspirations of the people at large of this area. Formerly known as 'Doboka College', the institution was formally initiated with a few students in the TDC classes in the year 1986 with due permission from the Gauhati University. The first building of the college was donated by the famous Anfar family of Hojai. In kind consideration to the long-felt need of a college and paying tribute to their generosity, the sponsoring body of the college renamed it as 'Haji Anfar Ali College' after the name of their heavenly father.

The philanthropic donors of Anfar family have never turned a blind eye to the needs of the college. They contributed a handsome amount for the construction of a central library cum administrative building of the college. Acknowledging their generous contribution, the college authority also named the two blocks of the building after the names of their mothers as Sam-sun Nehar Begum Library and Juhra Begum Administrative Block. However, the college has built up a New Administrative Building with the grants offered by the State Govt. capacitating in it the office of the Principal and the different Departments and classrooms.

Haji Anfar Ali College, Doboka was granted recognition by the University Grants Commission under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956 in the year 2009

and since then the college has been getting financial assistance from UGC under its different schemes such as Indoor Stadium, UGC Network Resource Centre, Extension of Classrooms, Computer lab etc. and of late a Women's Hostel with Warden's Quarter.

The College has been consistently maintaining high academic standards and good institutional social responsibilities. The college is permanently affiliated to the Gauhati University, Assam and it had gone for the NAAC assessment and accredited with a prestigious C++ Grade in the year 2005 for the first time. The IQAC of the college has been taking initiatives for accreditation measure to carry out and implement the initiatives and responsibilities of the college. The IQAC has been acting effectively in compliance with the recommendations of the Peer Team, NAAC in implementing the diverse quality enhancing measures during the Post-accreditation period and thus brought the institution to the stage for 2nd Cycle of Assessment and Accreditation by the NAAC. In that stage of assessment, the college is able to achieve a prestigious grade "B" from NAAC, Bengaluru in 2016. This grade is the outcome of the collec-



tive and continuous efforts of the stakeholders of the college. Now we are working hard for the future course of actions planned by the IQAC of the college to make it an ideal institution in the field of higher education.

3. LOCATION

Free from the din and bustle of the town, the college is located in an ideal site, about ½ k.m. away from NH 54 (Golden Quadrilateral). The 30-bedded Hospital (CHC), Binnakandi Development Block, Telephone Exchange and some educational institutions stand near by the college. It is easily accessible from Nagaon, Hojai and Karbi-Anglong.

4. GOAL

The goal of the college is to generate new values in society without disrupting its heritage in view of the spirit of the place itself. The college aims at excellence in academic life. In attaining knowledge in the proper perspective and rising to the challenges that come along their way, the students must pursue knowledge with focus and perseverance with the aim to become the 'MAN OF MEN.'

- To inspire the students to preserve what is pure in our environment and to educate them to keep it unpolluted.






Haji Anfar Ali College, Along with other colleges affiliated to Gauhati University, will follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) of Course Curriculum from the Academic Session 2022-23. Students admitted newly to B.A. 1st Semester in this Session will come the new course Curriculum.

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as an innovative talent and skill based effective system, ensuring greater freedom of choice and mobility in academic pursuit, envisages the following key features.

- CBCS marks a shift in focus from the teacher-centric to student-centric education.
- Students may undertake as many credits as they can cope with (without repeating all courses in a given semester if fail in one/more courses)
- This system allows students to choose inter-disciplinary, interdisciplinary courses, skill oriented papers (even from disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude)
- CBCS marks education broad based and at par with global standards. One can take credits by combining unique combinations. For example, Physics with Economics, Microbiology with Chemistry or Environment Science, etc.
- CBCS offers flexibility for students to study different times and at different institutions to complete one courses.

D. DISTANCE EDUCATION COURSE:

The College has Study Centres under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) and run the following courses as per the table shown.



6.1 PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

(i) Candidates will be selected on purely merit basis. The list of selected candidates will be notified 2-3 days before the actual date fixed for admission. Candidates selected for admission will have to take admission on payment of requisite fees on the date fixed for interview and admission, failing which the authority keeps the right reserved to forfeit claims.

(ii) There is provision for the reservation of seats for SC, ST, OBC and MOBC candidates as per Govt. rules in force.

(iii) There is a provision for admission for outstanding achievements in Sports, Culture etc.

(iv) Attested copies of the documents mentioned in 6.2 must be attached with the application for Admission Form (documents in original shall have to be produced for verification at the time of admission failing which their cases will not be considered)

(iv) Admission to B.A. 1st Semester course is provisional and subject to the approval of GU.

6.2 ADMISSION REQUIREMENT

- ➔ Students seeking admission to the college shall have to apply Online through www.haac.ac.in
- ➔ The completely filled up Admission Form must be submitted to the office of the college within the stipulated date and time.
- ➔ Student's undertaking form must be submitted along with Admission form.
- ➔ Smart Card Form should be filled-in duly for I-Card.
- ➔ Candidates need to submit photocopies of documents, but they have to produce the original copy at the time of admission. These are:
 - i) Mark sheet and Pass Certificate of the last qualifying examination.
 - ii) HSLC Certificate.
 - iii) Caste Certificate / Gap Certificate / Migration Certificate / Disability Certificate (if any)
 - iv) Certificate of NCC, Games, Sports, cultural activities if any.
 - v) Registration Certificate of AHSEC/GU.





6.3 ATTENDANCE

- v Students failing to attend a minimum of 75% classes in each subject will not be eligible to appear in any final semester examination.
- v Continuous absence for three weeks teaching days in a class is enough to debar the concerned student from appearing in the examination.
- v Scholarship holders with less than 75% attendance may be deprived of the scholarship.

6.4 ADMISSION COMMITTEE 2025-26

Admission for the Session 2025-2026 shall be conducted by the Admission Committee constituted by the Principal. All disputes and claims relating to admission matters will be settled by the Admission Committee. The decision of the Admission Committee shall be deemed final and bound.

6.5 ORIENTATION PROGRAMME:

The College conducts an Orientation Programme every year before the commencement of the First Semester regular classes in order to acquaint the new comers with the rules and regulations of the college. They are also trained about latest guidelines of the university and instructed about the Do's and Don'ts to be followed by them. Every fresher's attendance is compulsory in the said programme.

6.7 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

- ➔ Assamese/English in General Course
- ➔ English in Major Course.
- ➔ For students coming from English medium school, lessons are explained in English too.

6.8 EXAM REGULATION

➔ A student must pass all his Semester Examinations, including 'repeat' and 'betterment' chances within six years from the date of admission to the first semester course as per GU instructions.

➔ He / She will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular semester. The maximum three chances means 'three continuous examination years' irrespective of appearance by a candidate in the examination or not.

6.9 ELECTIVE SUBJECT COMBINATION

The students who opt Political Science as one of their elective subjects are not allowed to opt Education as another elective subject. Both Political Science and Education cannot go together as elective subjects for a student. The students must be careful in choosing their subject combination at the time of filling-up the Admission Form.



7. REGULATION OF TDC FOR SEMESTER SYSTEM

➡ A TDC shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Year. The schedule for Semester system shall be as shown below :

- (a) Third and Fifth Semester: June 1, 2025 & First Semester after the admission process.
- (b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester: January -1—June -30 (including examinations)
- (c) Summer Vacation: July 1— July 31.

Subject to change as per the Academic Calendar. However the existing schedule for Semester System is given in Annexure—I.

- d) Student's performance should be monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following:

Internal Evaluation : 40% Marks

External Evaluation : 60% Marks

- e) Internal Evaluation should be based on sessional examinations, home assignments, Seminars, and library work in each Semester.
- f) External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end on the Semester.
- g) The pass marks in each theory paper is 40 %
- h) In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- i) A student who could not appear or failed in any Semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
 - (i) First Semester with the regular Third Semester examination.
 - (ii) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester examination.
 - (iii) Third semester with regular Fifth Semester examination.
 - (iv) Fourth Semester with regular Sixth Semester examination.
- j) Only Major student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the First, Second and Third Semester, and may be allowed for "betterment" of marks in one paper in the Fifth Semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in that paper. However, there must not be any gap between two semesters.
- k) A student must pass all his Semester examinations, including "repeat" and 'betterment' chances within five years from the date of admission to the First Semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular Semester.



l) Since the Semester involve continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.

m) For any matter not covered under this Regulation for semester System will be settled as per Gauhati University existing rules. **Notes:**

(a) Notifications about Fill-up of Examination Forms, commencement of semester examinations, and declaration of results will be issued from the Office of the Controller of Examination, GU.

(b) Election of Student Union Bodies will be as per UGC notifications (vide Lyngdoh Committee Recommendations).

7.2. SESSIONAL/ INTERNAL EXAMINATIONS :

A. The exact date of the sessional examinations shall be fixed by the concerned teachers/colleges and that of the final semester examination by the C.E., G.U. The Controller of Examinations would announce the results of the final examinations. Admissions will be given by following University Rules. B. There will not be any limit regarding the number of failed papers for enrolling in the next higher semester class.

C. A candidate who fails to clear certain papers in a particular semester she/he may be allowed to repeat papers in the next opportunity or after completion of the 3rd Semester.

D. However, a student has to obtain pass marks in both Sessional (Internal) and External Examination separately. It is mandatory for the students to secure Pass Marks in Internal Examination. There is no chance for betterment in Sessional Examinations

8. EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION :

➤ The pass marks in each paper is 30 % of total marks in that paper (external+internal)

➤ A student who fails in one or more papers should repeat the papers by attending all the classes and by appearing for internal as well as external examinations at the next opportunity. A student shall get three chances for clearing the papers within six years from the date of admission to the degree programme.

➤ A student who has completed a semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester irrespective of number of papers where the student failed.

➤ In order to complete a course a student must obtain pass marks in all the papers in the semesters offered to the student in the degree course.

9. KEY POINTS OF SEMESTER SYSTEM

➤ A student will get maximum three chances to clear a particular semester. Three chances means, three continuous examination of a particular semester irrespective of a students or not. For example, a students of 2014 batch will get three chances i.e. in 2014, 2015 and 2016, thus student shall have to complete his/her all papers of 1st Semester Examination in 2016.



➤ Students can apply for repeat examination in one of the theory papers in 1st, 2nd and 3rd semester examinations. The provision for repeat examination is not application for 4th, 5th and 6th semester examination.

➤ In case the candidates are not satisfied with their obtained marks in the end semester theory examination results, they may apply for re-scrutiny, photocopy and re-evaluation of their answer script(s) by depositing prescribed fees and following the procedure as mentioned below.

A. Step-1: Application for the re-scrutiny of answer script(s) will be accepted up to 15 days from the date of declaration of the result. The re-scrutiny process will be completed by re-totalling of marks, checking unassigned/ omission of marks.

B. Step-2: Application for photocopy of the answer script(s) will be received up to 15 days from the date of declaration of re-scrutiny result. One can apply for photocopy along with the re-scrutiny. The photocopy of answer script will be provided only after re-scrutiny of the respective copy/copies of the Answer Script.

C. Step-3: Application for the re-evaluation of answer script(s) will be accepted up to 1 month from the date of dispatch of the photocopy of answer script(s) with following conditions.

Condition no. 1: A student should go through step-1 and step-2 before proceeding to step-3.

Condition no. 2: Re-evaluation is allowed if and only if "marks obtained" in a paper is more than 25% of the total marks.

➤ An answer script shall not be preserved for more than 6 (six) months from the date of declaration of result.


➤ No re-scrutiny, photocopy and re-evaluation of their answer script(s) will be allowed for internal examination, practical examination, project works and viva-voce examination.

➤ In case of any unforeseen reasons beyond the control of the University if there is gross damage of any answer scripts or missing answer scripts, special examinations shall be held within a stipulated time and shall attempt to declare results of such cases at the earliest, so that such students get proper justice.

➤ Re evaluation of answer scripts should be addressed to the Deputy Controller of Examination, GU through the principal within 15 days from the date of declaration of results in a 3 step process above- Rescrutiny Photostat copy of the script Reevaluation only if the score of that paper is 25% and above.

➤ It is mandatory for all students to appear in Sessional Examinations. The minimum mark for passing in each paper is 30% of the marks. No betterment option is applicable in the sessional examinations.

➤ Subject correction and switch over cases from Major to General course is allowed in 2nd semester only.



➡ Application Form for Name Correction, Withheld Result Clearance, Subject Correction, Duplicate Grade Sheet / Mark Sheet, Admit Card, Re-evaluation of Answer Scripts etc. may be downloaded from GU Website (www.gauhati.ac.in) and to be submitted to the principal along with necessary documents and fees.

11. LANGUAGE LAB

Haji Anfar Ali College has set up a high-tech, state-of-the-art language laboratory for the development of language skills of the students. The establishment of a language lab is a milestone in the modern technological achievement of the college. The lab prides itself in having the latest software's for the enhancement of listening, speaking, reading, writing, and an over-all cognitive competence of the students.

13. COMPULSORY COMPUTER EDUCATION FOR ALL

Students of Haji Anfar Ali College will avail themselves of a one-year Computer Course from this Academic Session. The course is free of cost except for a nominal registration fee of Rs. 500.00 to be paid at the time of admission. The main objective of the course is to give the students a basic grounding in the fundamental skills of computer.



KKHSOU has been established under the provision of the Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University Act 2005 and started its functioning on 11.12.2006.

The Study Centre, IDOL, Haji Anfar Ali College, Doboka, has already started its functioning with the objective to provide access to higher education to a large section of the people of the greater Doboka area including the neighbouring District of Karbi Anglong, Assam.


16.5. FUTURE PLAN:

18. SNB CENTRAL LIBRARY

The College Library has a fairly good repository of relevant reference and textbooks. The library has many rare books, journals and periodicals especially meant for under graduate and post graduate students.

18.1. DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY:

In addition to the Central Library, there is a well-stocked library in each department. Moreover, apart from the central & the departmental library, there has been a good number of books on Remedial Coaching, Entry in Services and Career Counselling in their respective cells.

18.2. READING ROOM

The library has a spacious & well-furnished Reading Room ideally suited to the sound environs of reading books, journals, magazines and newspapers.

18.3 LIBRARY HOURS

- Library will remain open from 8.45 a.m. to 4 p.m. on all working days.
- Books will be issued from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on all working days.

18.4 CONDITIONS OF BOOK LOAN TO STUDENTS

- Library Cards are issued at the time of admission.
- Student in the General Course are entitled to two cards while those with Major are entitled to 3 cards.
- A student can keep a book borrowed from the college library for a maximum period of 15 days from the date of issue of the book(s). If he/she fails to return the book(s) within the stipulated time, a fine as fixed fee Rs. 5/-(five) by the authority will be charged everyday beyond that date.

18.5 CONDITIONS OF BOOK LOAN TO THE TEACHING AND NON-TEACHING STAFF

- A member of the teaching staff will be entitled to borrow 20 (twenty) books for a session and is required to return the books on or before 30 June every year.
- A member of the Non-Teaching staff is entitled to borrow 5 (five) books for a session and is required to return the books on or before 30 June every year.

- ➡ The decision of the Principal and/or the Librarian in respect of fines and other related matters of college library will be final and bound.



18.6. BOOK BANK

In addition to library facilities, a unique measure has been adopted for lending books to the poor, meritorious, SC, ST and OBC students of the college from a special Book Bank.

18.7. SMART CARD

Smart I-Cards are issued to every regular students of the college for a nominal fee. Students must keep their identity cards with them during college hours and produce them when sought by the Principal or any other duly authorized person.

19. HAJI ANFAR ALI COLLEGE STUDENTS' UNION (HAACSU)

A union from among the students is formed every year in the greater interests of the students of the college, as per the Academic Calendar of the session. Every regular student with a minimum of 75% attendance can participate in the formation of HAACSU. The HAACSU Election is conducted on the recommendation of Lyngoh Committee and as per DHE Circular in force.

20. ANFAR JYOTI

The college publishes annually its mouthpiece ANFAR JYOTI to which students, teachers, alumni and other employees can contribute their own poems, stories, articles and other write-ups both in English and Assamese.

20.1 WALL MAGAZINE

The Wall Magazine of the college is updated in the months of August and December. In addition, special issues are brought out on festive and certain other occasions.

21. COLLEGE BULLETIN

The College authority published its yearly bulletin it has published its 2nd Edition of College Bulletin-2015 where different activities, programmes, infrastuctural development as well as academic progress have been highlighted. The next bulletin is in progress for publication.

22. TRAVELLING CONCESSION

Regular students of the college are entitled to students' travel concessions both by rail & air. (Subject to the rules of the Govt. of Assam)

23. SPORTS FACILITIES

The college provides facilities for both indoor and outdoor games. Students can take part in the various sports events and competitions held during the College Week. Winners and runners-up in various games and athletic events are encouraged by awarding attractive prizes. Individual championship and best performances in games and sports are also given due credit with



covetous awards. Very recently, the college has engaged an expert coach to train the students in sports and athletic skills. In view of the increasing importance of physical education in today's world, this special arrangement is made with the purpose of grooming the students to become accomplished athletes and sportspersons.

24. INDOOR STADIUM

Haji Anfar Ali College boasts the acclaim of an impressive Indoor Stadium. The stadium is the first of its kind in this vicinity. It is a multi-purpose stadium distinguished by its considerable sports facilities.

25. WOMEN'S HOSTEL

A two-storeyed Women's Hostel within the campus of the college is already complete. It is hoped that the hostel will go a long way towards meeting the long-standing problem of accommodation for the girl students coming to the college from far-off places not only from the District of Karbi-Anglong, but also from many remote villages of the entire part of the District of Hojai.

26. ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING & DEPARTMENTAL BLOCK

The construction of an all-new Administrative Block within itself a capacious Departmental Block is an added glory to the infrastructure of the college.

27. COLLEGE CANTEEN

Haji Anfar Ali College owns a spacious and elegant canteen, which remains open during college hours. The canteen provides light refreshment at an affordable price.

28. DRINKING WATER FACILITY

The college supply pure drinking water facilities for its students.

29. SCHOLARSHIPS

Students from economically disadvantaged background can avail themselves of a Special Fund for Poor and Meritorious students of the college. Besides, meritorious students are eligible for State Merit Scholarships, National Scholarship, Minority Scholarship, Sitaram Jindal Foundation Scholarship & Ishan Uday UGC Scholarship.

30. GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. Students must be regular and punctual in attending their classes and 75% Attendance in the classes held is a must for the regular students as per latest University norms.



2. Use of mobile phone in the college classroom is strictly prohibited in the greater interests of the academic environment.
3. No student shall resort to any violence both within and outside the college.
4. No student shall show disregard to his or her teacher or to any senior student.
5. Disobedience and indecent acts on the part of any student are sternly dealt with.
6. Students cannot indulge in ragging. Anyone found guilty of ragging will be expelled from the college.
7. Damaging, defacing, devaluing or destroying of any college property will lead to penal action as deemed fit and proper by the college authority.
8. Habitual or unreported absence from the college will disqualify a student from appearing in the examinations of the college.
9. Students will have to keep the college furniture, building, its walls, windows, doors, electric fixtures and the campus clean, tidy and intact.
10. Students will have to appear duly in the Unit Test, Terminal & Annual exams, Tests and Final examinations without fail as per rules; failing which fine will be imposed.
11. Students will have to cultivate the quality of politeness and decent behaviour.
12. No student shall adopt unfair means in the examinations.
13. Students shall not damage, mutilate, deface and tear any of the library books or its pages.
14. No student or office bearer of the college students union shall damage any of the sports goods or musical instruments. Nobody will be allowed to keep such items in his or her custody without proper authority from the Principal.






