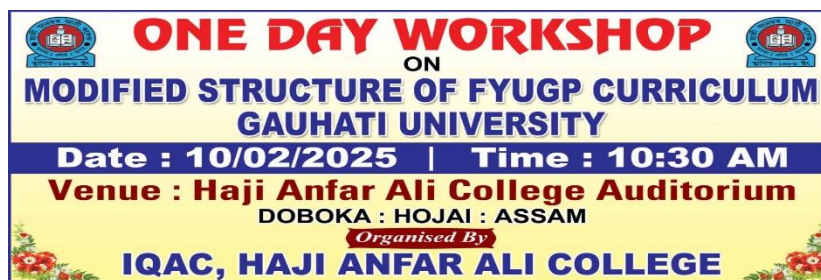
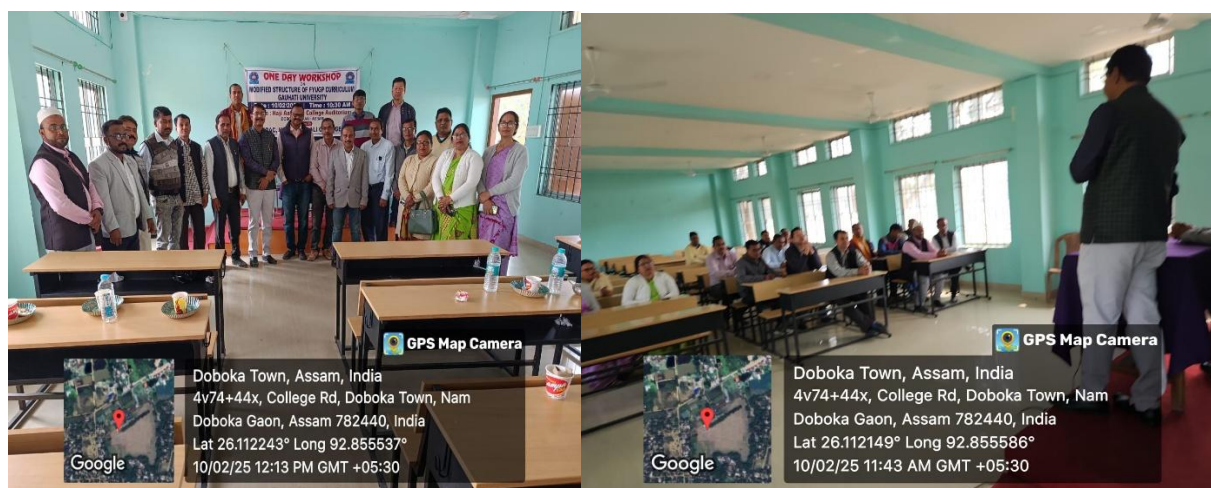


## One day workshop on Revised GU-FYUGP Curriculum



Gauhati University has undertaken significant initiatives to implement the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. To ensure effective adoption and understanding of the revised curriculum, the university conducted a series of awareness programs targeting faculty members, affiliated colleges, and principals. Keeping in mind the existing 4<sup>th</sup> semester students affiliated to Gauhati University, Haji Anfar Ali College, Doboka recently organised a one day workshop on the revised curriculum of GU-FYUGP 4<sup>th</sup> Semester students who are studying at present in the Colleges affiliated to Rabindranath Tagore University(RTU), Hojai. The workshop was attended by a large number of faculty members from the different neighbouring Colleges under RTU along with other Faculty members of other colleges affiliated to Gauhati University. Mr. M. Islam, Vice Principal of the College welcomed the participants and urged them in his keynote address to be more introspective in calculating the credits as per the recent modifications. Dr. Sahab Uddin, Associate Professor in the Department of English, acted as Resource Person . He pointed out in detail, about the simplifications made by the GU authority in terms making the credits equal to all the semesters. There is no basic difference between students having Major and Minor courses. Both the categories of students must have to their credit, at the end of 6<sup>th</sup> Semester, 21 core papers and 120 credits. Detailed distribution of courses across six semesters, specifying major, minor and allocation of credits were the key concepts of the workshop. The Resource Person emphasized the implementation of internship program for the 4<sup>th</sup> Semester students as per the guidelines of GU. Internship provides practical exposure to the students and he let the participants know that GU will circulate a guideline in no time for its proper implementation. The workshop was a very lively and interactive one. The faculty members actively interacted with the Resource Person.



Thus the workshop ended with a vote of thanks offered by A.H. Talukdar, Coordinator, IQAC. Everyone participated, enjoyed the high tea of the host institution.
